## 2. Ongoing

- a) Our association sponsored and is coordinating a controlled, randomized multicenter study on the "Effects of home-based pulmonary rehabilitation in patients with severe or very severe chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD)". We are currently enrolling study participants.
- b) ARIR is continuing its work drafting documents for **GARD Italy** (Global Alliance Against Chronic Respiratory Disease) relative to the following **projects**:
  - Training courses for health-care providers to arrive at early diagnosis of COPD
  - Ongoing assistance for COPD patients

## 3. Routinely

As usual we are:

- <u>Disseminating information about respiratory physiotherapists and the importance of what we do in Italy</u>
- Continuing education, training and teaching:

As of today, more than 270 health-care facilities in Italy have turned to our association for ongoing training in respiratory care. In addition to the basic courses, this year the topics were:

- non-invasive ventilation;
- rehabilitative pneumology in patients with tracheal cannula
- functional tests and the role of the physiotherapist
- respiratory physiotherapy in the neuromuscular patient and in the non-compliant patient – Level I course -
- retraining the respiratory patient for physical exercise and endurance;
- managing complications and comorbidity in the patient with chronic respiratory disease (Giornata ARIR 2011)
- 3 basic courses on respiratory rehabilitation

On the whole, and not counting university credits for the master's program, 207 continuous medicine education credits (CMEC) were assigned in 2011.

In conjunction with the University of Milan, we are continuing a:

 Master's Course in Respiratory Rehabilitation and physiotherapy: the course will be held again in 2012 for the sixth consecutive year.
